



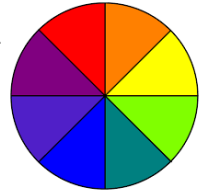
### Colour Wheel Activities

Can you name all the colours on the wheel? Which is your favourite?



*Go on a Treasure Hunt around your house:*

- Can you find different items that match the colours on the wheel?
  - Can you see any shapes?
  - How many items of each colour did you find?



*Go on a Treasure Hunt outdoors:*

- Can you find any natural materials that match the colours on the wheel?
  - Can you see any shapes?
  - How many items of each colour did you find?

### Floating and Sinking

You will need:

- A basin of water/ the sink/ the bath
- A selection of household objects/ toys (that you don't mind getting wet.)



- Can your child name all of the objects? What do you use them for?
- Before you begin introduce floating and sinking.  
"If the item floats it will stay on top of the water- it is light."  
"If the items sinks it will go to the bottom- it is heavy."
- Take one item at a time and before putting it in, ask: "Do you think it will float or sink?" (This will develop prediction skills.)
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- At the end, sort into two piles: items that float and items that sink.
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*Junk Art Activity:*

You could make a boat that will float on the water- use some junk or items from around your house.
