Outdoor Learning

We hope we will be blessed with lots of good weather during May and are able to spend more time outside as we have lots of jobs and learning to do. We will be learning about Sun Safety (if it appears) and will be particularly focussing on this during Sun Awareness Week (1^{st} - 7th May.) Please take to your children about the importance of wearing sun cream, hats and sunglasses as well as the dangers of sun exposure.

Both classes are really looking forward to our Tuesday visits to Forest School and are keen to learn more about birds, hedgehogs and other creatures that live in the Forest. We are also hoping to learn more about the water based animals.

Planting

We have now planted all our vegetables (celery, onions, peas, cabbage and beetroot) as well as some herbs and wildflowers. Now it's time to care for them and watch them grow. During the next month we will be taking it in turns to water them, using the rain collected in our water butt. We are hoping for lots of sunshine to also help them grow.
