
Skills and Attributes your child will be developing this month.

I am trying hard to:

- -stop and listen to what is being said
- -build on my concentration skills
- -recognise my own name
- -use materials to make 3D models
- -count small sets and count aloud
- -explore shapes and colour—rectangle/white
- -observe and explore 'winter'

What you can do to encourage and help at home

- -engage your child in two-way conversation
- -use their name first when you seek them to follow short instructions, make eye contact
- -ask your child to carry out tasks that are a little
- tricky to do and give them time to do these
 -make your child's name together and display at
 home
- -have fun with recycling materials to make anything you want
- -invite your child to count objects in the kitchen, setting the table, washing, etc
- -shape and colour hunt
- -winter walk—talk about changes/weather what we
- -have fun in the snow if it comes! freeze some water, observe ice etc





Key Vocabulary

Winter—frost, snow, ice, cold, freezing, bitter, slippery, icy, melting, sparkling, glittering, blizzard, softly, gently, twigs, branches, de-icer

Cold Lands—Artic—Inuit, igloo, huskies, polar bears, icebergs, penguins, sledges, puffin, artic hare, caribou, seals

Hot lands—Jungle, forest, bamboo, trees, mud, swamps, lion, tiger, giraffes, elephants, parrots, monkeys

Birds—robins, crows, sparrows, bird cake, seed, bird table, crumbs, currants, raisins, lard
