- -The Arts—learning Christmas songs and exploring percussion instruments, taking on a role.
- -EME—explore colour and shape
- -Use my early Maths language in play—size/positional

This is how you can help me....

- -Talk with me about key Christmas and Winter vocabulary
- -Share a story with me and encourage me to take turns as I turn the pages
- -Look at patterns, shape and colour on wrapping paper—design your on blank strips
- -Explore wrapped presents—use size language to describe them
- -Take two presents—talk about comparisons between each one
- -Let me help you with any outdoor garden jobs
- -Remind me to hold your hand to and from SNS
