Skills and Attributes your child will be developing this month.

I am trying hard to:

- stop and listen to what is being said
- build on my concentration skills
- recognise my own name
- use materials to make 3D models
- count small sets and count aloud
- explore shapes and colour—rectangle/white
- observe and explore 'winter'

What you can do to encourage and help at home

- engage your child in two-way conversation
- use their name first when you seek them to follow short instructions, make eye contact
- ask your child to carry out tasks that are a little tricky to do and give them time to do these
- make your child's name together and display at home
- have fun with recycling materials to make anything you want
- invite your child to count objects in the kitchen, setting the table, washing, etc
- shape and colour hunt
- winter walk—talk about changes/weather what we wear
- have fun in the snow if it comes! - freeze some water, observe ice etc
