Skills and attributes being developed in May at SNS are:

Language Development: I am trying hard to-

- continue to build on attention and listening skills
- continue to build on sequencing skills as I learn about order -First, then, next

PSED - I am trying hard to-

- continue to build on my concentration skills
- continue to develop ability to play collaboratively -work as a team
- develop further awareness of how actions

affect others—reach agreement

Thinking Skills/Personal Capabilities-I am trying hard to -

- build on ability to observe, identify and record information
- develop ability to persist at activities and those that present a challenge
- develop ability to make simple predictions

Key Topics/Vocabulary

We are continuing to extend our Spring theme through growing things and mini beasts. We will be watching the caterpillars grow into butterflies and learn about its life cycle. We will be spending time in the garden looking for and observing mini beasts. A lot of this work is linking to outdoor and Forest School learning as the children continue to care for our vegetables and observe their growth over the next few weeks. 'Under Construction' extends on early mathematical concepts as the children use tape measures, count, recognise numerals, and build on 3D shape recognition. We will be fixing things about the house, drawing plans and working with real tools too.

Safety in the Sun

Although playing in the sun is enjoyable it can be harmful,. If we are lucky enough to see the sun, please apply sun cream to your child at home in the morning and provide a sun hat too.

We would encourage parents to make sure that their children are wearing seatbelts, play where it is safe, know where children are at all times and not to talk to strangers. Numeracy

Please encourage your child to develop their counting skills and begin to identify numbers in their environment. Use

opportunities indoors and outdoors. Have fun as you are out and about with your child-find numbers in the shops, involve your child in counting grocery items, vehicles. etc.

Using digital devices sensibly

Digital technology has become a major influence in our lives. Managing technology well can help to ensure that it has a positive impact on your child and can help avoid potential problems.

- Give your child your full attention and don't let your phone interrupt your interactions with your child.
- Adopt a routine and stick to it, e.g. no devices at mealtimes or after 6 pm as they can disrupt conversation and your child's sleep patterns.
- Limit screen time and remove all devices from the bedroom at night balance, supervision and moderation are key.
- Be selective about what they watch and what you watch in front of them.
- Play with your child on their devices to avoid it becoming a solitary activity.
- Ensure the necessary filters and protection are updated they keep your child safe.
- Work as a TEAM Talk Explore Agree Manage what your family does online.
- Always log out of your own online accounts and clear your browsing history as even news reports can cause distress to young children.
- Limit the time you spend on digital devices around your children
