Skills and Attributes

Your child has begun to develop their 'thinking Skills' and 'Personal Capabilities' as they continue to build on and consolidate their skills through play in June. There will be further development as he/she enters primary education in September.

- 1. Managing Information identifying and recording simple methods to record information. Find information from other resources [reference books]
- 2. **Thinking, Problem Solving and Decision Making** be able to sequence information and events; make simple prediction and see possibilities; ask different types of questions; identify and name objects, living things as the same or different and put into groups; make close observations.
- 3. Being Creative be willing to take on new challenges; experiment with ideas through writing, drawing making models; be curious and ask questions about the world around them using all their senses to explore and respond to what they hear, see, touch, smell and taste.
- 4. Working With Others Work and Play together; learn to share, listen to each other, cooperate, make decisions together; be willing to join in, develop their confidence.
- 5. **Self Management** Asking a friend for help; be able to make decisions and choices; concentrate on what they are doing; talk about what they are doing and what they have learned.
