BUSY DAYS AT STRATHFOYLE NURSERY SCHOOL



Skills and attributes being developed during 'Settling In' Sept/Oct at SNS are:

Language Development: I am trying hard to-

- •show good looking and listening during story time
- •use kind words as I play and ask for help when I need it
- •talk about my news and join in rhymes/songs
- •learn to listen to my friends and adults who help me

PSED - I am trying hard to-

- •get to know my friends and adults who help me
- •learn early routines
- •have a 'happy' play

Physical Development-I am trying hard to -

- wash my hands well
- put on my coat and shoes
- move safely as I play inside and outside
- •build on my fine and gross motor skills

This is how you can help me

- Talk about my name and those of my new friends there is a class list in this newsletter
- •Help me remember that SNS is a 'happy place' and chat to me about nursery rules that help keep me safe
- Praise me for all my work and efforts—talk to me about work I bring home and hang it up
- •Come close to me, first say my name and then tell me what you need me to do. I will try my best to listen—this takes time to learn
- •Have hand washing fun with singing the "super soap song" with me
- Keep helping me practice with putting on my coat and shoes—Velcro fasteners help me to do it by myself
- •Remind me to hold your hand when coming to and from nursery school

Topics

Our topic for Sept/October is 'I am special, I am ME!' Children focus on themselves, babies and families. We are beginning to explore Autumn now and later in October Harvest time and Halloween

<u>Language/Numeracy</u>: Each month you will receive a monthly vocabulary list and ideas for you to further develop your child's numeracy and language skills.

Key Vocabulary

Colour—blue, orange, black, red, yellow and brown

Shape—circle

Autumn—leaves, hedgehogs, squirrels, chestnuts, conkers, acorns, berries, fluttering, floating, crunchy, rustling, rosehips, blackberries, hibernate.

Family—Mum, Dad, brother, sister, Granny, Grandad, Aunt, Uncle, cousin.

Babies—nappies, bottle, blanket, cot, cradle, lullaby, crawling, crying.

Halloween—spiders, bats, webs, pumpkin, scary, spooky and creepy.

SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES TO DO WITH YOUR CHILD AT HOME

Talk to your child about members of their family.

Find a baby photo and talk about how they have changed.

Play 'I spy' with orange, yellow and brown items in your home.

Discuss and name different fruits and vegetables when out shopping

Talk about healthy eating and encourage your child to sample new fruit and veg.

Talk about the leaves changing colours and then falling from the tree

Get your child share the 'Nursery Rhyme Pack' with members of the family—the children are excited to bring them home.

Outdoor Play - Please can you send in a pair of labelled <u>WELLIES</u> to stay in SNS and make sure your child wears a warmer coat now autumn is here. Thank you.



School Dinners:

Children will be having dinners for the first time next week. The menu has been discussed with School Meals and the children will experience the dinner routine in a safe environment. If you still need to discuss your child's dietary needs/allergies, please get in touch.
